Born in 1976, Rodney James hails from Brooklyn, NY where he works and resides. Focusing on both traditional forms of B/W and color photography, as well as alternative processes both traditional and digital, his work provides an insight into the ideas of beauty, emotion, and spirituality through both color and form. In 2003, he received his BA in Media Arts/Photography from Long Island University. Inspired to work with the youth of the community, Rodney joined forces with the International Center for Photography's The Point Community Program instructing, and mentoring kids in the use of 35MM cameras, as well as developing and printing techniques in the Bronx, at Hunts Point. His photography has been shown at downtown Brooklyn's Selena Gallery, as well as in publications, including Long Island University Sound 2009 yearbook. He is currently focusing on a long-term project exploring the various ideas, and facets of African Diaspora traditions here in New York City. This personal work, which is both documentary, as well as reflective, offers an insight into a hidden spiritual community steeped in tradition, passed on and preserved by African slaves and their descendents here in the New World, specifically in New York City. He is now currently pursuing an M.F.A in photography at Long Island University.
